### **Information about the Workshop**

The Newer Scholars Workshop is now accepting applications for participation. You may be a “newer” scholar if you’ve published fewer than two full-length law review articles or book chapters, but we intend this definition to be inclusive. If you feel new to writing, we want you to join us!

The full day will run on Zoom from 10 a.m. to 2:15 Phoenix time on May 13 (1:00 - 5:15 p.m. EST), and it will be broken into two distinct sessions. Feel free to register to join us for all or just part of the day.

The morning will be dedicated to presentations and conversations about producing scholarship. All are welcome to attend these sessions. You can simply register [here](#) if you are interested.

The afternoon workshops will be for smaller groups, devoted to small group discussions of works-in-progress. All who attend this session will need to submit a draft and provide feedback on others’ work. We are taking a broad view of scholarship. Drafts can be on any topic and suitable for publication in any forum. We will provide feedback on drafts of full-length articles, book chapters, practical pieces, and any other works that have a legal academic bent. Drafts do not need to be complete works, but must be beyond the outline stage.
